## Charity adapts to a virtual world

A sports, education and wellbeing charity was awarded as its team rose to the challenge of delivering services online.

Colleagues at Inspire+ provide physical education services for local schools and adapted admirably to the challenges of the pandemic.

After planned services were suspended by lockdown, Inspire+ offered its coaches and ambassadors to schools free of charge to keep children fit and give them a sense of normality.

Operations manager Chris Graves praised his staff as they made an unprecedented swap to delivering their classes virtually when schools were forced to close.
